SEAL OF THE SEMINARY



The seal of United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities was created as the seminary was being formed. It represents the seminary's Christian heritage and honors the merger of Mission House Theological Seminary and Yankton School of Theology that formed a new seminary, United. The arrangement of the hexagons in a triangular shape emphasizes the Trinity. The lower hexagons symbolize Mission House and Yankton as the foundation upon which United sits. The seal reads 1862, the year Mission House was founded, and "Soli Deo Gloria," Glory to God Alone.

UNITED THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY OF THE TWIN CITIES

United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities is a school with deep roots in the Upper Midwest. United was established in 1960 through the merger of Mission House Seminary of Plymouth, Wisconsin, and Yankton School of Theology of Yankton, South Dakota.

Mission House, the German Reformed Prophetenschule ("school of the prophets"), was founded in 1862 to meet the religious needs of German immigrant settlements in Wisconsin and other Midwestern states. Established in 1869, Yankton School of Theology served the needs of German Congregational churchs in middle America. The merger of these two schools expressed not only the spirit of union that led to the formation of the United Church of Christ in 1957, but responded to a need for an ecumenical center of theological studies in the Twin Cities. By its charter, United Theological Seminary is a multidenominational, ecumenically focused seminary of the United Church of Christ. A new campus was acquired and developed in the Twin Cities suburb of New Brighton and classes began in the fall of 1962. In 2018, the seminary moved to a vibrant, centrally located, accessible location in the heart of the Creative Enterprise Zone of St. Paul. Standing in the broad Reformed theological tradition, United Theological Seminary is committed to an ecumenical style of theological learning. Representatives of major religious traditions are found in its faculty, staff, and student body.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER REV. TRACI BLACKMON

Rev. Traci Blackmon is the Associate General Minister of Justice & Local Church Ministries for The United Church of Christ. Initially ordained in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, Rev. Blackmon served in various ministry capacities for nine years, prior to becoming ordained in the United Church of Christ and installed as the first woman and 18th pastor in the 162-year history of Christ The King United Church of Christ in Florissant, MO, where she recently completed her tenure as Senior Pastor. A registered nurse with more than 25 years of healthcare experience, Rev. Blackmon's clinical focus was cardiac care, and in later years her focus shifted to mobile healthcare in underserved communities with the greatest health disparities in her region. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing from Birmingham – Southern College (1985), and a Master of Divinity degree from Eden Theological Seminary (2009).

As pastor, Rev. Blackmon led Christ The King in an expanded understanding of church as a sacred launching pad of community engagement and change. This ethos led to a tripling of both membership and worship attendance, expanded membership engagement opportunities, and the establishment of community outreach programs. Regionally, Rev. Blackmon's signature initiatives have included Healthy Mind, Body, and Spirit, a mobile faith-based outreach program she designed to impact health outcomes in impoverished areas. Sacred Conversations on Solomon's Porch, quarterly clergy in-services designed to equip local clergy to assess physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual health concerns within congregational life, Sista SOS Summit, an intergenerational health symposium for women and girls, and Souls to the Polls STL, an ecumenical, multi-faith collaborative that was successful in providing over 2,800 additional rides to the polls during local and national elections.

A featured voice with many regional, national, and international media outlets and a frequent contributor to print publications, Rev. Blackmon's communal leadership and work in the aftermath of the killing of Michael Brown, Jr., in Ferguson, MO has gained her both national and international recognition and audiences from the White House to the Carter Center to the Vatican. She was appointed to the Ferguson Commission by Governor Jay Nixon and to the President's Advisory Council on Faith-Based Neighborhood Partnerships for the White House by President Barack H. Obama. Rev. Blackmon co-authored the White Privilege curriculum for the United Church of Christ and toured the nation with Rev. Dr. William Barber of Moral Mondays and Repairer of the Breech, Rev. Dr. James Forbes of The Drum Major Institute and pastor emeritus of The Riverside Church in New York, and Sister Simone Campbell of Nuns on the Bus proclaiming the need for a Moral Revival in this nation

Rev. Blackmon is a graduate of Leadership St. Louis and currently serves on the boards of The Samuel DeWitt Proctor Conference, Chicago Theological Seminary, and WomanPreach! She has received several awards and recognitions, inclusive of: The White House President's Volunteer Service Award; The St. Louis American Stellar Award; 2015 Ebony Magazine Power 100; Deluxe Magazine Power 100; St. Louis University – Community Leader of the Year; 100 Black Men of St. Louis Community Leader of the Year; The Coalition of Black Trade Unionist – Drum Major Award; NAACP – Rosa Parks Award; Rosa Parks Award – United Trade Unionist; The Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis Woman in Leadership Award; National Planned Parenthood Faith Leader Award; The United Church of Christ – Antoinette Brown Leadership Award; Honorary Doctorate, Eden Theological Seminary

Rev. Blackmon currently resides in both St. Louis, MO and Cleveland, OH and was named 2017 Citizen of the Year by The St. Louis American and as one of St. Louis' 100 most influential voices. Rev. Blackmon is the proud mother of three adult children: Kortni Devon, Harold II, and Tyler Wayne Blackmon.

HONORABLE GOVERNOR MARK DAYTON Recipient of the Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters



Throughout his life, Mark Dayton has embodied a commitment to the common good. As a teacher, Minnesota State Auditor, United States Senator, and Governor of the State of Minnesota, he has worked to advance causes like affordable health care, equal educational opportunity, marriage equality, social justice, and peace.

At the end of his term as governor, Dayton stated that, as a boy, he considered becoming a Protestant minister (MPR, December 2018). Instead, he lived out his journey of faith through years of public service, committed to making the world a more just place. This journey would also bring him to United.

In 1987 and 1988, Dayton audited courses at United to study the New Testament, as well as ethics with James B. Nelson, professor emeritus of Christian Ethics. At a Governor's Prayer Breakfast, Dayton explained this call, "I figured anyone involved in politics could use a refresher course in Christian ethics." He went on to say, "I have always been struck by Jesus' choice of the word: 'Neighbor.' Our neighbor is whoever's sitting next to us. Whether or not she's of the same nationality, race, religion, political party, social views, or sexual orientation. Whoever he is -- he's is the one we're supposed to love." As a school we are thankful for the legacy of Jim and grateful that Dayton benefitted from his teaching. We are also grateful for Dayton's later service on the United board of trustees and for his family's commitment to the Dayton Scholarship, which has helped hundreds of students follow their calling over the years.

The Doctorate of Humane Letters is a distinct degree that seeks to affirm Dayton's years of public service and his journey of faith. We applaud the many ways in which he has lived into both. Public service as an expression of faithful vocation matters more than ever in our time. We celebrate the ethical leadership of Mark Dayton and continue to advance our commitment to educate leaders like him, who live out their commitments to ethics and justice as leaders in churches, chaplaincy settings, nonprofits, and throughout society.
